Grammarians appear at with grammar as the component of analysis. Discourse analysis is concerned with the relationship between language and the contexts it is used in. It is not a methodology of teaching and knowledge of discourse is not always useful to the language teacher. Though, an awareness of how language is used in relation to context, roles and relationship of speakers, can sometimes be used and be useful in the classroom, especially in getting learners to sound more natural.

Writing teachers have been focusing on discourse structures in their classrooms since the 1960s when teaching moved from the sentence level to the discourse level with the introduction of a focus on rhetorical functions in the teaching of second language writing. Examples of rhetorical functions include descriptions, narratives, definitions, exemplifications, classifications, compare and contrast, and cause and effect.
