Answer: Hydroxyl groups can form ionic bonds as well as hydrogen bonds. Hydroxyl groups are water soluble (hydrophilic). The adrenaline compound consists of three –OH groups, whereas Estrone only consists of one. The cell membrane is lipid soluble (hydrophobic), thus it will only allow hydrophobic molecules or uncharged molecules through the membrane.

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Answers to end-of-chapter questions 1) The enzyme-catalysed reduction of an aldehyde requires one equivalent of the cofactor NADH, which is oxidised to NAD⁺. However, if ethanol is added to the reaction, aldehyde dehydrogenase can catalyse its oxidation to acetaldehyde. In the process, NAD⁺ is converted back to NADH.
