Triangulation refers to the use of multiple methods or data sources in qualitative research to develop a comprehensive understanding of phenomena (Patton, 1999). Triangulation also has been viewed as a qualitative research strategy to test validity through the convergence of information from different sources.

Four types of triangulation are proposed by Denzin (p.301):5 (1) data triangulation, which includes matters such as periods of time, space and people; (2) investigator triangulation, which includes the use of several researchers in a study; (3) theory triangulation, which encourages several theoretical schemes to enable interpretation of a phenomenon and (4) methodological triangulation, which promotes the use of several data collection methods such as interviews and observations.

Triangulation facilitates validation of data through cross verification from more than two sources. It tests the consistency of findings obtained through different instruments and increases the chance to control, or at least assess, some of the threats or multiple causes influencing our results.

Yin's 5-step approach to data analysis is used to analyze data enable researchers to analyze the textual data (Yin, 2011). The term "triangulation" or "concurrent triangulation" comes from the three concurrent levels of testing in many triangulation studies: first the quantitative level (such as interviewing and observation), then a qualitative level (such as a survey and statistical analysis of outcome data) and then a quantitative analysis that incorporates the findings from the other two tests.
